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## DOWNTOWN WICHITA LAUNCHES ALLEY DOORS PROJECT

### Project transforms alley and back-of-building doors into unexpected art destinations

Wichita, KS – November 5, 2020 – Downtown Wichita has launched the Alley Doors project, which repurposes alley and back-of-building doors into a discovery-driven urban gallery. The doors, which are at various properties throughout the downtown district, can be viewed by the public at any time, and provide a safe, socially distanced opportunity to enjoy local art during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Earlier this year, Kansas based artists contributed to an online artwork database. Participating property and business owners in the downtown district used this database to select artwork that was vinyl printed and applied to their selected alley door.

“Public art is essential to creating a unique environment and this project will add to the growing vibrancy in the downtown district. We are excited for our community to experience these unique works of art and hope they will inspire anyone who seeks them out or stumbles across them,” said Emily Brookover, Director of Community Development at Downtown Wichita.

The goal of this project is to increase the foot-traffic and visibility of overlooked spaces downtown and thus enhance safety, combat vandalism and create surprises for passersby. Downtown Wichita received a grant from the Knight Foundation Fund at the Wichita Community Foundation to launch the Alley Doors project.
