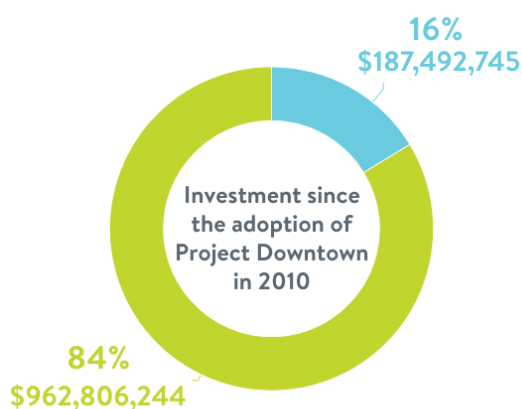

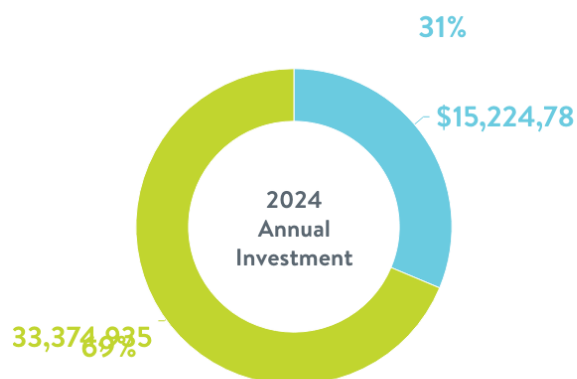

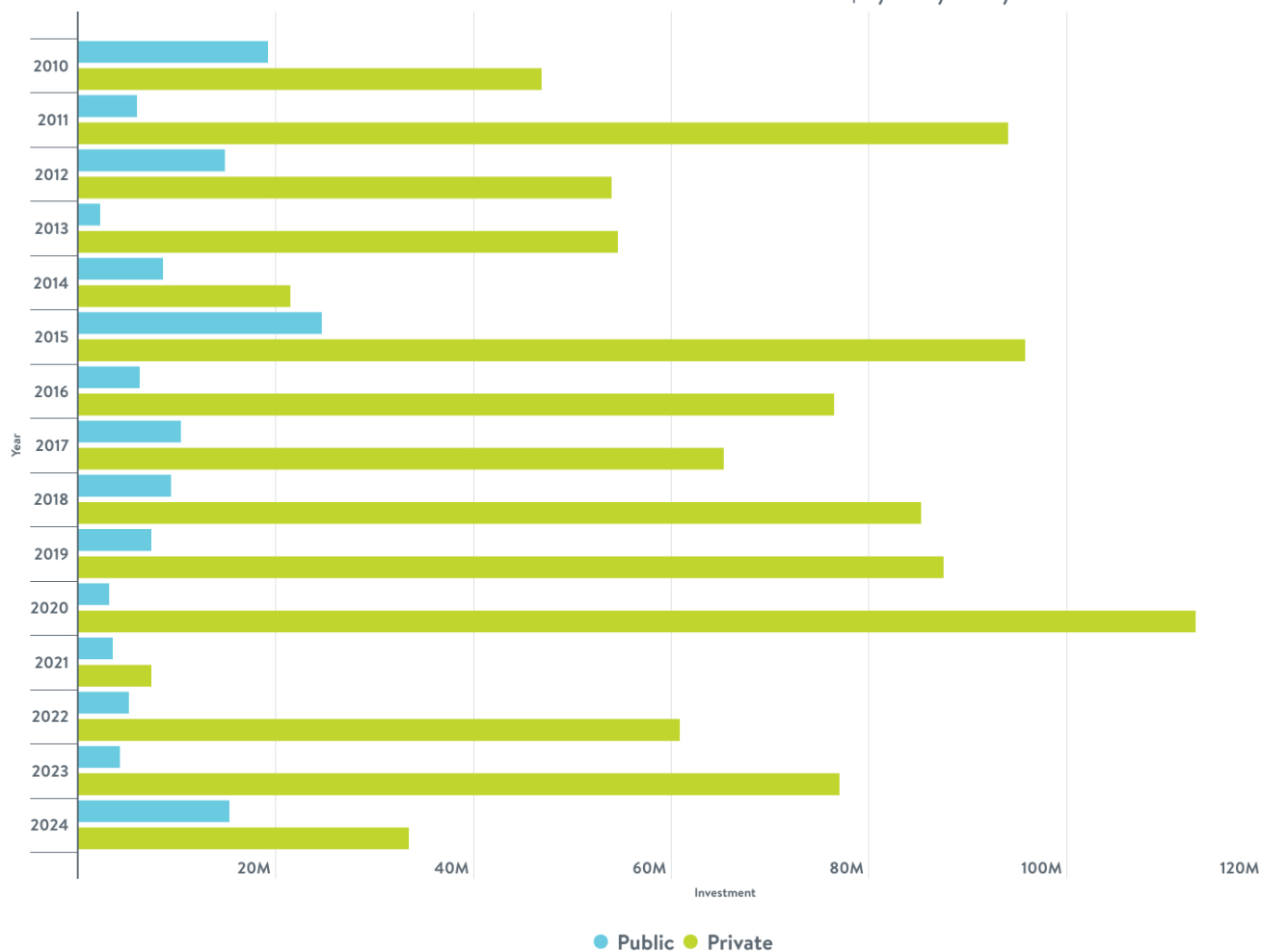

SSMID 2010-2024 Total Investment: \$1,150,298,990

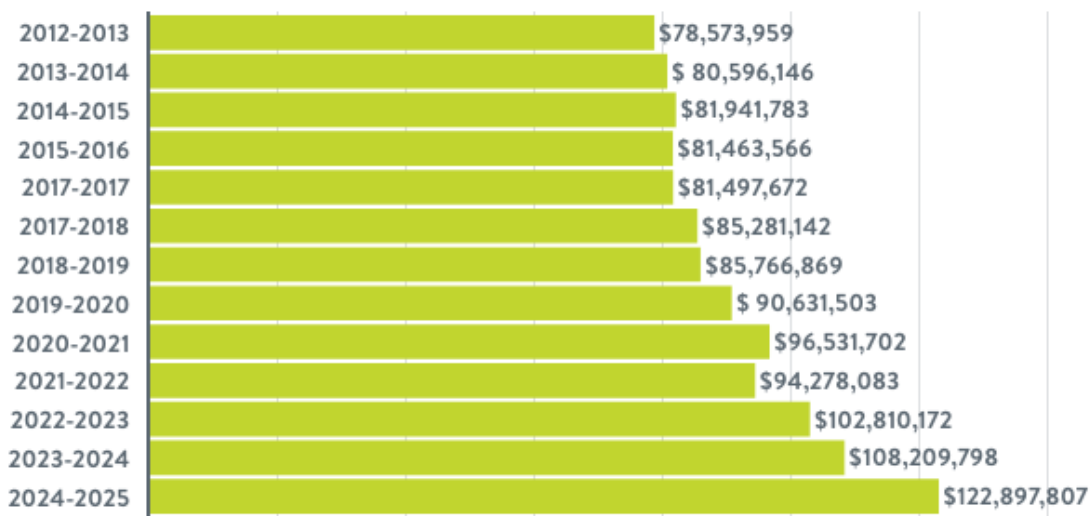




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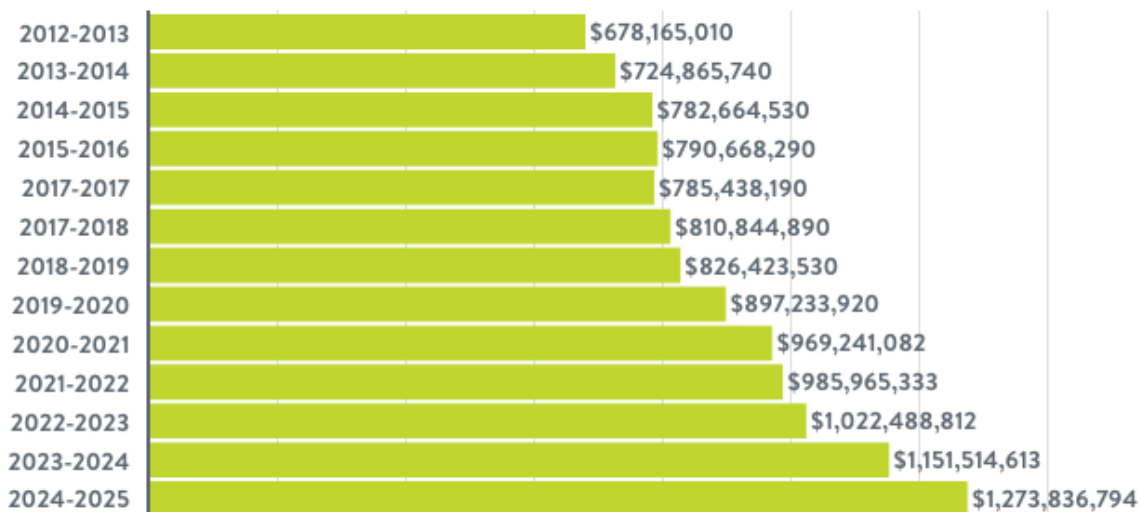
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SSMID Assessed Real Property Value⁵
