Front Porch

The Front Porch project paired six Wichita-based creatives and six local business owners together to create outdoor extensions of their businesses. The porches debuted on Friday, July 1, 2022, during the First Friday art crawl. This temporary pilot project will last one year, ending on June 30, 2023. Inspiration for the project came from the idea of the midwestern front porch - a space that is crucial to community, family, identity, and conversation. The funding will support a new initiative called the Front Porch project.
