Downtown medical school now recruiting students for the inaugural class to begin Aug. 2022

\$75 million project will revitalize five historic buildings

Project Downtown: The Master Plan for Wichita recognizes the William Street corridor as a key catalyst for the transformation of our downtown into a vibrant urban center. The proposed Kansas Health Science Center – Kansas College of Osteopathic Medicine (KHSC-KansasCom) project will revitalize five historic buildings (see individual projects listed below) along this corridor – bringing the vision set forth in [Project Downtown](#) to life.

On Dec. 13, 2021, The Kansas Health Science Center - Kansas College of Osteopathic Medicine (KHSC-KansasCom) announced that the school has received approval from the Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation (COCA) to start recruiting students for the 2022 academic year after receiving pre-accreditation status. The anticipated size of the inaugural class is 85 students with plans for continued growth each year. [View a press release](#) to learn more.

At the [mayor's news briefing](#) on December 3, 2020, representatives from the proposed KHSC-KansasCOM announced that the school has been granted candidate status from the Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation. This important step in the accreditation process allows the project to move forward with plans for this forward-thinking medical school.
